Ethics Questions

All projects involving **humans or animals** at the Greater Vancouver Regional Science Fair (GVRSF) must meet the Youth Science Canada ethics policies, which also apply to projects at the national Canada-Wide Science Fair. We encourage students and teachers to become familiar with these guidelines – not only to avoid disqualification and disappointment, but also to understand the basic principles of research ethics.

Please read <u>"Ethics in STEM Projects"</u> a general overview of current Youth Science Canada ethics requirements and answer the following questions:


If you select "YES" to any of the following questions, you must email the ethics committee for approval at ethics@gvrsf.ca if you have not done so already.

1. Humans were used as participants in this project and the project meets the criteria for low risk, as defined in Youth Science Canada Policy [Participation of Humans in Research - Low Risk]

(i.e., the project involves a survey of attitudes and beliefs, skill tests, or observations of behaviour with the participants' consent where there is minimal risk to the participant).

The following are typical examples of low-risk projects:

- Surveys
- o Exercise experiments
- Ingestion experiments (food and drink)
- Caffeinated beverage experiments
- Absorption through the skin experiments


